NEW CHALLENGES

Since opening to the public in 2019, Reflections has earned museum operating support through a rigorous grant program administered by the state's Division of Cultural Affairs. This year, for the very first time, the governor vetoed the entire funding for that program, affecting not just us, but cultural arts and museum programs across the state.

The board is having to take a hard look at our operating assumptions and is working on two tracks to grow our income base. One is expanding the service income we receive from private tours by proactively contacting various groups and businesses to inform them of this opportunity. The second is to widen our reach to individual donors, foundations, grantors, and businesses to ask for support.

Reflection of Manatee Receives Preservation Award

The Florida Trust for Historic Preservation presented Reflections of Manatee an award for excellence in archaeology for its 2021 Recovering History by the Manatee Mineral Spring project.



The archaeological project revealed material evidence of the Angola maroon settlement, including post molds and other features, an intact barrel well and belongings that point to global connections and daily activities at the site, and painted a clearer view of everyday life in the Village of Manatee during 1840-1880. The project was a highly successful collaboration among nonprofit organizations, academic institutions and governmental agencies, providing a deeper understanding of the cultural and historical context of this crucial avenue for trade, transportation and communication since the earliest human occupation. Reflections curates the archaeological collections and exhibits selected items in its Archaeology of Freedom and Manatee Settlement rooms.


